Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding;

- 1. Have written breastfeeding policy that is routinely communicated to all health care staff
- 2. Train all health care staff in the skills necessary to implement this policy
- 3. Inform all pregnant women about the benefits and management of breastfeeding
- 4. Help mothers initiate breastfeeding within half an hour after birth
- 5 show mothers how to breastfeed and how to maintain lactation even if they should be separated from their infant
- 6. Give newborn infants no food or drink other than breast milk unless medically indicated.
- 7. Practice "rooming in" allowing mothers and infants to remain together 24 hours a day
- 8. Encourage breastfeeding on demand-whenever the baby is hungry
- 9. Give no artificial teats or pacifiers (also called dummies or soothers) to breastfeeding infant's clinic.
- 10. Foster the establishment of breastfeeding support groups and refer mothers to them on discharge from the hospital.
